The Challenge


Inadequate institutional and human capacity have hindered the adoption of evidence-based tobacco control policies and strategies across Africa. Without intervention, this gap could lead to severe public health consequences.

The intervention

We strategically partner with 12 CSOs in 10 African countries*, aligning with the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control. We prioritize flexibility, planning, and robust oversight to ensure program effectiveness. Our focus goes beyond funding; we build long-term sustainability by strengthening project management, leadership and governance, and financial systems, empowering these institutions to independently drive tobacco control initiatives in the future.

Unlocking Potential

Africa boasts a wealth of scientific talent. The ACBF's "Strengthening Capacity of Strategic Partner Institutions in Africa" (SPIA) program addresses a critical need – strengthening the institutional capacity of leading biomedical research institutions prioritizing vaccine development in Africa. This program is supported by the Gates Foundation, ensuring that African institutions are at the forefront of global health progress.

Building a Strong Foundation

SPIA provides targeted support to five key biomedical research institutions. The program employs a data-driven approach, conducting thorough needs assessments to identify each institution's specific gaps. These assessments inform customized improvement plans to address inefficiencies and unlock their full potential.

A Story of Progress

Now in its third year, the program is well on its way towards developing well-run institutions and fostering sustainable progress. Half of the initial implementation plan is complete, focusing on leadership coaching and enhanced operational systems.

Measurable Impact

Rigorous evaluation is a cornerstone of SPIA. The program assesses participating institutions across four key areas: efficiency, effectiveness, relevance, and sustainability.

Early results are promising, especially for the main institution currently being supported. Enhanced control measures have led to consistently clean audits, while operational efficiency has improved. Furthermore, the Science for Africa Foundation (SFA), a key recipient, has diversified its funding base and continues to produce impactful research.

Building a Sustainable Future

SPIA recognizes the importance of gender equity and strong leadership. The program has demonstrably fostered a more gender-responsive culture within SFA, with women holding a significant share of leadership positions. Additionally, SPIA has provided leadership training and mentorship, ensuring a solid pipeline of future leaders.

Collaboration is Key

This program exemplifies the power of collaboration. The Ghana drug discovery project serves as a prime example. SPIA facilitated a visioning exercise involving six universities, leading to the establishment of a collaborative research consortium. This spirit of collaboration extends beyond individual projects, fostering a network of strong African research institutions poised to make groundbreaking contributions to global health.

The SPIA program goes beyond empowering institutions; it empowers Africa to lead the way in solving global health challenges. This, in turn, translates to better healthcare for all!

A Silent Threat

These diseases threaten animal health and hinder production, endangering farmers' livelihoods across the continent. Recognizing this critical challenge, ACBF joined forces with the World Association for the Advancement of Veterinary Parasitology (WAAVP) to establish the African Network (WAAVP-AN). This initiative addresses a critical gap in veterinary research and practice.

Laying the Foundation for Success



Building a solid foundation is essential for any endeavor. ACBF's support focused on establishing a legal entity for WAAVP-AN, complete with clear governance structures, sound financial management practices, and a robust five-year strategic plan (2022-2026) that outlines ambitious yet achievable goals for the network's future.

Empowering Collaboration



Knowledge is power, and collaboration is key. ACBF understands this and has created a central network Secretariat. This central hub fosters communication and collaboration among WAAVP-AN members, creating a platform for sharing best practices and promoting research collaboration across Africa.

From Seed to Success



ACBF's impact goes beyond administrative support. They recognized the need for resources and equipped WAAVP-AN to develop compelling project proposals. This enhanced capacity to secure funding has resulted in the launch of US\$3 million in research and capacity-building grants, demonstrating the program's potential for significant impact. The partnership has yielded tangible results within a short timeframe. WAAVP-AN was officially launched in Benin and is currently undergoing registration in Kenya.

A Model for Collaborative Action



The ACBF-WAAVP-AN partnership exemplifies collaborative action. By strengthening veterinary parasitology research and practice in Africa, this initiative has already demonstrated tangible progress in safeguarding animal health and strengthening livelihoods, offering a blueprint for addressing other critical challenges facing the continent.


